Minutes from July Town Council Meeting

Minutes of the Regular Meeting, Town of LaGrange, Wyoming, meeting at the Town Hall on July 13th 2017 at 7:00pm. Present were: Councilmen Mike Huseby, Mike Meysenburg and Ben Cline. Town Clerk Cathy Stoddard and Attorney Ed Buchanan were also present. Public Works Director Tracy Pragnell, Councilman Joel Tremain and Mayor Mark Marshall were absent. There were no visitors attending.

Acting Mayor Mike Huseby called the meeting to order at 7:02pm. Mike Meysenburg moved to approve the minutes as read. Ben seconded, motion carried.

Acting Mayor Huseby asked for old business. The personnel policy and town policies were tabled until the August council meeting.

Acting Mayor Huseby asked for new business. Clerk questions were discussed. No motions were made. Mike Meysenburg moved to pay the bills, Ben seconded, motion carried. Ben moved to adjourn the meeting at 7:36pm.

ATTENTION DOG OWNERS!

If you feel threatened by, or are harassed by a dog running at large, you MUST file a written, signed complaint at Town Hall in order for any action to be taken.

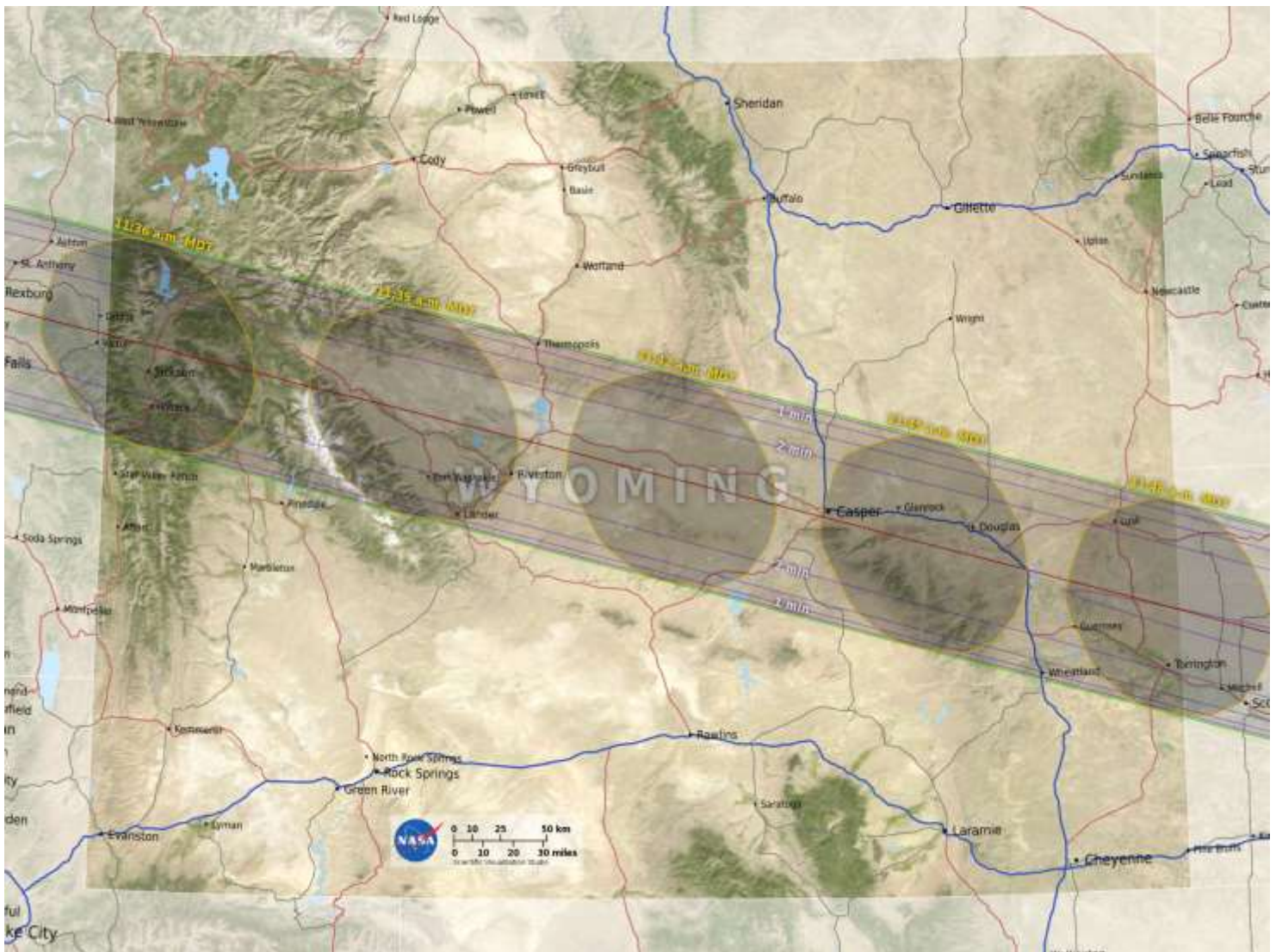

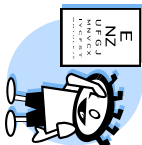
