Mayor Marshall called the meeting to order at 7:02pm. Ben Cline moved to approve the minutes as read. Mike Meysenburg seconded, motion carried.

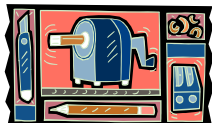

### Open Computer Lab

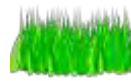

### FULL FIRE BAN HAS BEEN LIFTED

### PARTIAL FIRE BAN IS IN EFFECT

This is to advise residents and land owners in Goshen County that at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Goshen County Commissioners on August 15th, permission was given to the Fire Warden to lower the Fire Ban restrictions citing the culmination of the 2017 Solar Eclipse activity risks as reasonable cause to warrant such action. Controlled burns on private lands during times of a "partial fire ban", while not recommended are allowed within reason. The responsibility to maintain a "controlled environment" remains with you. If your land is in Goshen County, you are also required to call the Torrington Dispatch at 532-7001 prior to starting a controlled burn of any sort. Be advised that fire conditions are still high. Driving or parking in tall weeds and grasses are to be avoided. All of the Partial Fire Ban requirements and mandates are to be strictly adhered to. Under a partial closure, discharge of fireworks and all outdoor burning is prohibited on all state and private lands in Goshen County except:

Trash or refuse fires between 6PM and 8AM, inside containers with spark arresters and located within a cleared area ten feet in radius are permitted.

Camp fires contained within an established fire ring are permitted.

Charcoal fires within enclosed grills are permitted.

Use of acetylene cutting torches or electric arc welders in cleared areas ten feet in radius are permitted.

Propane or open fire branding activities in cleared areas ten feet in radius are permitted.

Portable stoves, lanterns using gas, jellied petroleum, pressurized liquid fuel or fully enclosed shepherd type wood stoves piped with a spark arrester are permitted.

The public's cooperation with the Partial Fire Ban requirements will be most appreciated and will help our emergency personnel keep you and your property safe as possible.

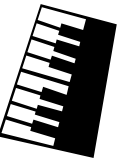
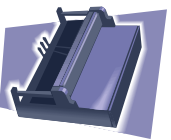
