Minutes from July Town Council Meeting

Minutes of the Regular Meeting, Town of LaGrange, Wyoming, meeting at the Town Hall on July 13th 2023 at 7:00pm. Present were: Mayor Mark Marshall; Councilmembers Mike Huseby, Kirk Haas, Mike Meysenburg and Diane Humphrey. Public Works Director, Tracy Pragnell; Town Clerk, Cathy Stoddard and Attorney Lena Moeller were also present. There were several visitors attending.

Mayor Marshall called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. Diane moved to approve the minutes as read. Kirk seconded; motion carried.

Bruce Hale came to discuss moving a trailer on his trailer court. Jennifer Pragnell came to address the town council. Brenden Heidner sent a letter for public comment. The letter was provided to each of the town council members. Town attorney Lena Moeller stated, due to the letter having names for personal identification we are barred from reading it in public comment.

Mayor Marshall opened the meeting for public comment. Robin Boyd addressed the council and had questions about chickens in town and town ordinances. Peggy Oedekoven addressed the council about chickens and the ordinance.

Mayor Marshall asked for old business. Tracy gave an update on the grant projects. Sargent Irrigation was awarded the bid for the water development grant and will be moving forward. The contract for the State Land & Investments Grant for a new town shop was signed and returned to SLIB for review and additional signatures. The benches and swing set purchased from the Goshen County Recreation Grant will be placed after the walk path is complete. Mike Huseby moved to approve the engineering amendment for project re-bid in the amount of \$5,000. Mike Meysenburg seconded; motion carried. Dianne moved to approve the notice of award to Paul Reed Construction. Kirk seconded motion carried. Tracy stated the project will move forward and hopefully be completed in September. The electronic speed signs were discussed, no motions made.

Mayor Marshall asked for new business. Kirk moved to approve the water permit and sewer permit transfers for location 124 5th Ave to 124 ½ 5th Ave. Mike Meysenburg seconded; motion carried. Resolution 6-23 was discussed. No motions were made. Clerk and public works questions and comments were discussed. Mike Huseby moved to support the Ag Appreciation Breakfast at the Goshen County Fair in the amount of \$100. Diane Humphrey seconded; motion carried. No other motions were made. Mike Huseby moved to hire a process server. Mike Meysenburg seconded; motion carried. Kirk moved to pay the bills. Mike Huseby seconded; motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:20pm.
