Minutes from June Town Council Meeting

Minutes of the Regular Meeting, Town of LaGrange, Wyoming, meeting at the Town Hall on June 13th 2024 at 7:00pm. Present were: Mayor Mark Marshall; Councilmembers Kirk Haas, Mike Huseby, Diane Humphrey and Mike Meysenburg. Town Clerk, Cathy Stoddard; Public Works Director, Tracy Pragnell were also present. Attorney, Lena Moeller was absent. Visitors attending were; Linnea Dix, Jeff & Brenda Sharp, Peggy Oedekoven, Robin Boyd, Peter & Esther Davis and Phil & Lora Gomes.

Mayor Marshall called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. Mike Meysenburg moved to approve the minutes as read. Kirk seconded; motion carried.

Phil and Lora Gomes came to make a formal request to close off a section of main street on Saturdays from 6pm-9pm beginning June 22nd until September for line dancing. Mike Huseby moved to approve the closing of the street per request. Diane seconded; motion carried.

Mayor Marshall asked for old business. Tracy gave quick updates on the water study and shop project. Kirk moved to approve the third & final reading of FY 24-25 Budget Ordinance #148. Mike Meysenburg seconded; motion carried. This will include an increase in water rates by \$4 and sewer rates by \$2 monthly.

Mayor Marshall asked for new business. Cathy asked for verification on a mobile home park billing. Clarification was given. Tracy stated a couple street lights are out by the highway and Wyrulec will be replacing them. Kirk moved to pay the bills. Mike Meysenburg seconded; motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:19pm.
